The following Friday, the Boyd County Boys Cross Country Team and sophomore Kaci Koenig attended Nebraska State Class D Cross County Meet at the Kearney Country Club. Will Nelson, junior, started towards the beginning of the pack and didn't look back. Nelson crushed his own personal record and the Boyd County State Cross Country record with a time of 17:14. He earned 14th place. Records continued to be added as junior Ethan Zeisler grabbed the 4th place position on the Boyd County Top Ten State Board. Zeisler placed 31st with a PR time of 18:00. Brook Strom, another junior, placed 87th with a time of 19:11. McGill ran over a minute faster than he did at state last year finishing 103rd and crushing his PR with a time of 19:36. Issac Jensen, junior, competed hard and finished 114th with a time of 20:14. The boys team placed 10th overall making them the highest ranking team out of our district.

Sophomore Kaci Koenig stepped onto the course for her very first run at state. Koenig also decided she should join the boys in setting records and adding her name to the Boyd County leader boards. Koenig placed 52nd out of 121 girls who started the race. Her time of 22:11 is a PR and lands her in the third position on the Boyd County Top Ten State Cross Country record board.
